Korea Divided

- 1910: Japan occupied the Korean peninsula.
- 1945:
 - Japan defeated in WWII.
 - USSR occupied the north; US occupied the south.
 - Coincides with the start of the Cold War.

The Korean War

- 1948: Soviets withdrew from NK. Kim Il-sung became leader.
 - Kim was a communist guerilla who fought the Japanese.
- 1950 (June 25): NK invaded SK to forcibly unify.
- 1950 (June 27): The UN authorized intervention. Led by the US.
- 1953 (July 27): armistice signed. The borders remained as they were.



Korean War Casualties

- 1.2 million including civilians.




The Koreas Since the War


- 1985: NK signs Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT).
- 1986: NK starts nuclear research.
- 1994: Kim Il-sung dies. Replaced by his son, Kim Jong-il.






North Korea Famine

- 1994–1998.
- Reasons:
 - Natural disasters.
 - Loss of Soviet support.
 - Economic mismanagement.
- Deaths: 500,000–3,000,000.




North Korea

- 2011: Kim Jong-il dies. Replaced by Kim Jong-un, the second son.
 - Age 29–31.
 - Attended school in Switzerland under assumed name.

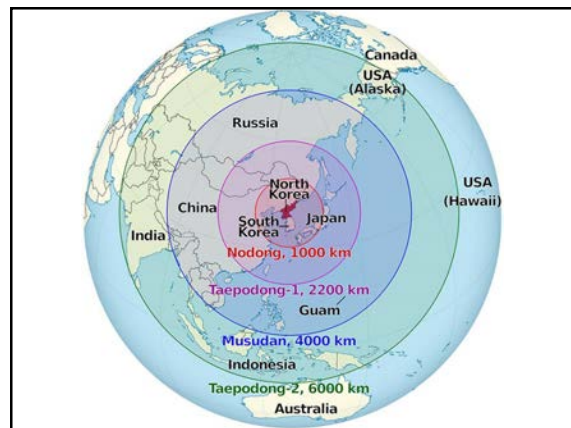

NK Nuclear Program

- 2006: 1st underground nuclear test followed by UN sanctions.
- 2007: deal – fuel for shutting down reactor.
- 2009: 2nd nuclear test.
- 2012: Unsuccessful missile test.
- 2013: 3rd nuclear test.
- 2014: Two successful medium-range missile tests.
- 2017: Two successful long-range missile tests.

Global Response

- Sanctions, sanctions, sanctions.
 - NK continues its nuclear development program.
- Deals.
 - Temporary effect only.
- SK "Sunshine policy" 1998-2008.
- Six-party talks (NK, China, US, Russia, Japan and SK).
